We're partnering with Gleaner's Food Bank for another month of trading nonperishable foods for your library fines. **From March 19th-April 27th, each nonperishable good that you donate forgives \$1.00 of your fines.** So for those of you who wanted to keep that DVD or book out just a little longer than you were supposed to (we get it, we're human too and have all been guilty of this), donate some non-perishable goods to help out your community and take care of those fines at the same time. Unfortunately, you can't pay off those \$25 worth of fines this way, as we have a **cap at \$5.00**, but feel free to donate as many nonperishables as you'd like! **Don't have any fines?** Please feel free to donate nonperishable goods as well!
