

# HUDSON'S: DETROIT'S WORLD-FAMOUS DEPARTMENT STORE

Do you remember a time when shopping was an adventure, window displays glittered, and Maurice Salads were served in gracious sky-high dining rooms. ## PROCTER CEMETERY PHASE III

During the summer of 2023, Society members cleaned a few stones using D2 and surveyed the Procter Cemetery to determine the next course of action. Phase III will be divided into two separate projects.



The first smaller project would raise, level, and clean 34 GRANITE markers and two BRASS markers that are sinking



below the grass. The estimated cost is \$2,890. The second larger project would restore 50 MARBLE tablets that are dirty, leaning, and in disrepair. At an estimated price of \$400 per marker, this portion of the project would cost around \$20,000.

Our goal is to complete the first portion in 2024 while raising additional funds over the next couple years for the larger project.



Our Society received some help in the conservation of Procter Cemetery from local Boy Scout Troop 125. Four Scouts spent three hours removing brush growing around the markers.


