During Civil War Charles was located in the Eighth Michigan Cavalry. He was enlisted at Jackson for 3 years, he then transferred from Company I to Company E at Marietta, Georgia. He mustered out at Nashville, Tennessee september 22, 1865.

His rank was private, meaning he was the lowest enlisted rank.

He worked as a farm laborer after the war, it's still a job you can have to this day working with crops.

It wasn't listed that he had any illnesses from the war but he did survive the war

He was in the Regiment 8th Cavalry, which was a Army Unit fought on horses. Which was constituted in 1866 and he fought in several battles.
