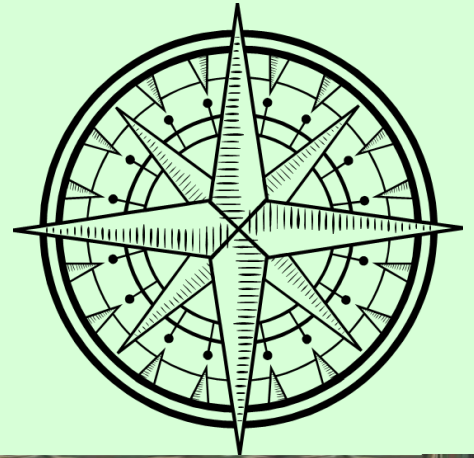


Civil War Soldier Project:

Age Before _ Happened

Hartman Richard Cornell Sr. was 75 years old before he died as a civil war veteran.

He was enlisted at the age of 20 on may 17th, 1864.

He died from chronic diarrhea and a shell wound from his service in the war after being discharged august 29th, 1865



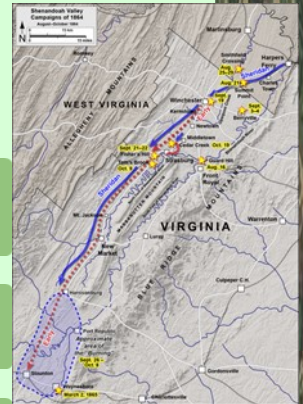
Where he was at times

He was born in April 20, 1845 in Chemung, New York.

He served in an Infantry. Infantry are soldiers that fight on foot.

For most of his life after the war he lived with his family in Romeo, Michigan

He fought in the battles of Cedar creek and the Petersburg campaign.



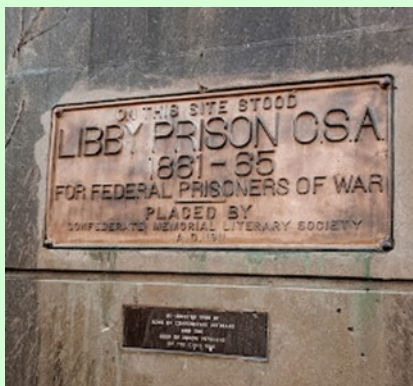
Petersburg Campaign Map

What happened to him after the war

He was a prisoner and possibly got his chronic diarrhea condition at Libby Prison

He got a shell wound on his head as a result from his service in the civil war

He did not die from his service and filed for retirement on november 4th, 1872.



His Family

He had at least 5 sons and 5 daughters.

He married Harriet Simpson Snover on February 15 1868.

- he was a private in the 148th New York Infantry
- he was a part of Company K
- He enlisted may 17th, 1864 and was discharged August 29th, 1865
- prisoner at Libby Prison
