Isaac Crawford:



- Isaac Crawford was 83 years old when he died.
- Isaac was enlisted on August 14th, 1862. When he was enlisted he was 29 years old.
- Crawford died of a heart disease, the actual name of the disease is unknown.



Isaac Crawford:

Isaac Crawford was from New Jersey. He was a Blacksmith rank in and a blacksmith rank out. He was located in Gettysburg (PA), the Wilderness, Cold Harbor, Shenandoah Valley (Trevilian Station), and the final Appomattox Campaign in Virginia in civil war. He served Cavalry which means highly mobile units focused on reconnaissance, surveillance, target acquisition, and rapid assault.



- Did he have a job before? Yes, He had a farming job prior to the civil war.
- Did he have any ailments or illnesses related to the civil war? Yes, he was wounded in battle on September 17, 1862.
- Did he have any injuries from the war? Yes, he had valvular disease of the heart and varicose veins of the left leg.
- Did he have any family? He was married to his wife Rachel and they had children, specifically mentioned as having a son named Elijah and a daughter named Nancy Crawford.



Unique and research about Isaac Crawford:

- He severed for 2 years and 9 months
- He wrote a letter to his wife THE LETTER
- Isaac Crawford was a minister in early Michigan Methodism, and served at Milford, among other places
- He evidently was expelled from the ministry of the M. B. Church.
- Could have been related Riley Crawford.
