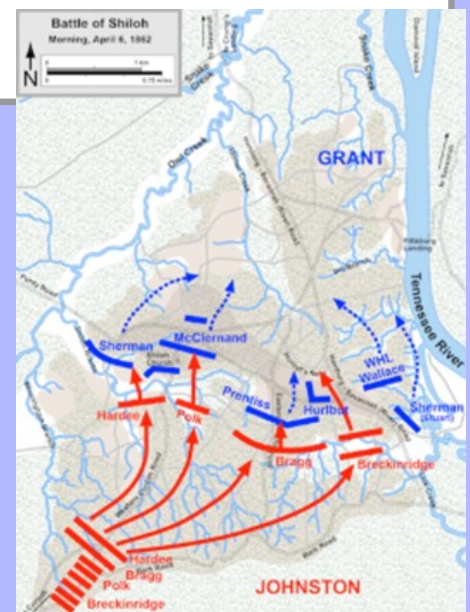


Alonzo D Lee

- Time he lived from: December 10, 1841-April 11, 1908
- Died at age 67
- Was 21 years old when he was enlisted in Company B, First Ohio Light Artillery- Artillery is a union large-caliber unit during the American Civil War.
- Then he transferred to Company K, First Ohio Light Artillery.
- He died from enlargement of the heart do to Rheumatism- Rheumatism is a term used for different conditions causing chronic pain, stiffness, and inflammation in joints.

Alonzo's Battles and Birthplace

- Alonzo D Lee did not die in the Civil War, but was injured. He was buried in the Romeo Cemetery.
- Birthplace was Ohio
- He was in the Battle of Shiloh, which was the deadliest battle to that point. The battle proved that the civil war would be long and brutal. The Battle of Shiloh took place in Southwestern, Tennessee on April 6-7 1862.

Private

- Private is the lowest rank in the military and represents an entry-level soldier that carries out orders.

He served light Artillery

- Light artillery is a small mobile gun that was typically made up to 105 millimeters and was designed for easy transport and rapid deployment by infantry, airborne, or air-mobile force.

He did not have a job

- He did not have a job because he was paralyzed. He became paralyzed by getting thrown off a horse and injured his right side, and diarrhea himself.

Family, Illnesses, and injuries

- Alonzo did have an injury from the war. He was thrown off a horse and he was injured on his right side. Because of that injury he became paralyzed
- Alonzo suffered from 2 illnesses from the war. He suffered from paralysis and chronic diarrhea from being thrown off of the horse.
- Yes, Alonzo D Lee did have a family, he had his Mom, Almira Smith; his father, Rowland H Lee; and he also was married. We were able to find this information on his birth certificate.
